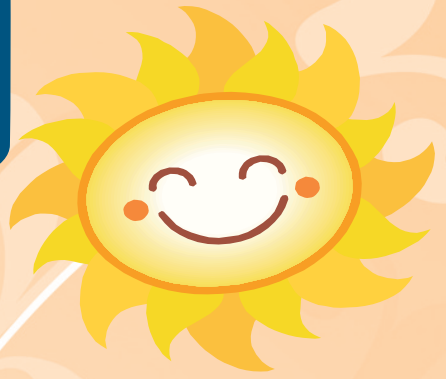

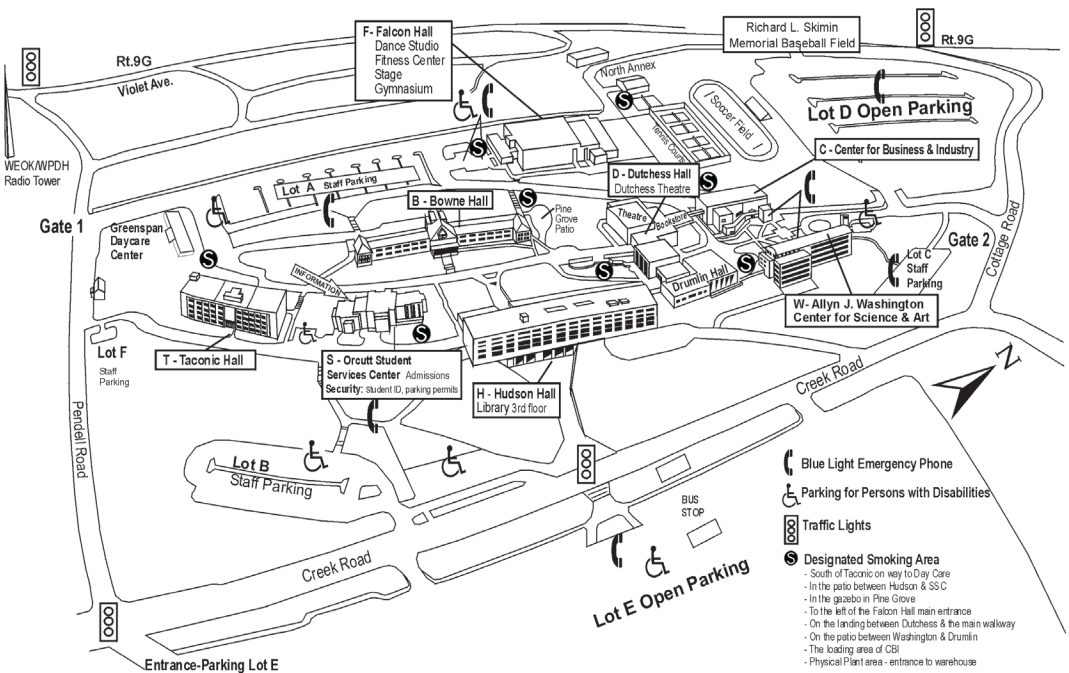

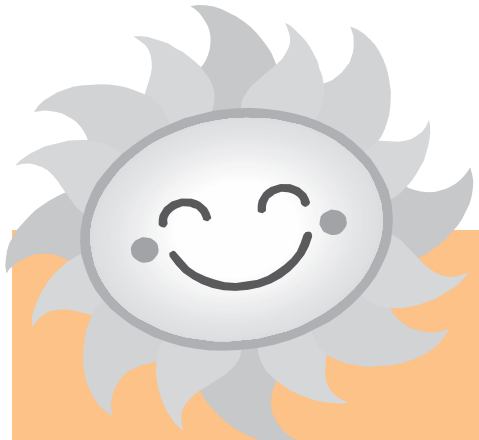
Offerings are divided into six categories:

Splash N Dash (For ages 5 - 14)

At **Splash N Dash Summer Day Camp at Dutchess Community College**, every day is an action-packed adventure of non-stop fun, forever friends, and lifelong memories.

Campers enjoy a general recreation day including:

- group games • sports • nature hikes • arts and crafts
- twice weekly swimming in an indoor pool and
- once weekly outdoor adventure trips to Fahnestock State Park.

The camp management are all experienced school-age childcare professionals, all staff are background checked and the camp is licensed by the Department of Health and is supervised by school-age childcare professionals.

The camp day is 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. *with drop off as early as 7 a.m. and pick up as late as 7 p.m.* Before and after care is available for children in all programs for an extra fee of approximately \$4 per hour. We will escort your child to any program on the DCC campus. Splash N Dash runs in consecutive 2-week sessions from June 27 through August 19 on the incredible Dutchess Community College campus in Poughkeepsie.

If your camper finishes their program at noon and you need care for the rest of the day, he/she can join the Splash N Dash Day Camp program and pay the one-week split session rate for a 2-week session. We will pick up and escort your camper to the Splash N Dash program.

Fees: 2-week sessions - \$399; one week - \$250

There is a non-refundable \$50 camper registration fee. Special rates for any camper attending any other DCC Kids on Campus program, for a one-week split session is \$200.

Each day you'll be given a series of challenges which must be overcome using basic materials, simple machines, tips from world famous inventors and the most important thing of all - your mind. If you were stranded on a desert island how would you survive? You will need to build shelter, find food and purify water, protect yourself and your teammates from the elements and find a way off the island. Journey to the future and examine the ultramodern inventions of the 23rd century. "Create" light saber, "green energy", and hovercraft. With a little bit of ingenuity you'll construct catapults and forts and then lay siege, fabricate a winning Egg Drop design, construct a dancing robot and assemble a Salt Water Fuel Cell Car to take home.

Learn how animals protect themselves: survey icy cold like a polar bear and dissect oysters to see how they resist an annoying itch. Build a bird feeder and mix your own seed blend to attract specific bird species. Make recycled paper. Tie-dye t-shirts with vegetable dyes. Test water for pollution, and then build a water filter to remove anything nasty. Construct a bug house for observing real, live bugs. Study the feeding habits of owls and look at the animal bones they leave behind. Learn about geology by growing your own crystal garden and breaking open your own geode. Pan for spectacular gems and minerals that can be found in the Hudson Valley.

15 hours of fun-filled, hands-on, secret agent themed science activities featuring 10 take-home projects! The five daily themes are Discover Detection, Funky Forensics, Science of Security, Sleuths on the Scene, and Spy Academy. During the week the agents put everything they have learned to the test. They will code and decode messages, use spy equipment on a surveillance shift, collect and analyze evidence, explore the science of tracking, practice facial reconstruction, and many other activities that are so top secret they cannot be described publicly! Take home projects include an ultraviolet Fingerprint Finder kit, Spyglasses that let you secretly watch people who are behind you, Spy-noculars, a Secret Code Breaker, and an Inspecti-kit for evidence collection.

They will also play with cool science toys and figure out how they work and analyze the amazing properties of slime. Projects that campers will make and take home include a periscope, an electric Newtonian color wheel, floating magnets, a static electricity stick, a superball, a color-changing "heat sheet", and more!

Learn about the various technologies that make space exploration possible while bouncing lasers around the room and take home an LED UFO. Build your own Mad Science model rocket, and launch several with the group. Campers will have lots of projects to make and to take home including a KEPLER'S Cube solar system puzzle, a Cosmic Chronometer, a Shuttle Copter, and Catch-a-Comet.

Installation of operating systems and basic networking will be covered. Several classes will also be spent introducing students to truly personalize their own machine.

Students who take the Studio Film Production class in the first session and wish to continue into the second session will work to further enhance their studio production skills and take the lead in the production of the Academy's Summer '11 short film. This film will be written and produced by members of the Studio Film Production Class in the second session.

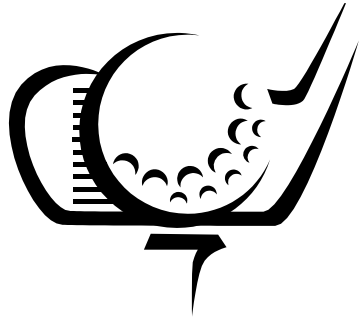

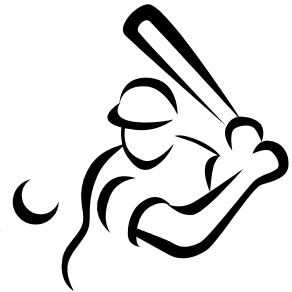
