

Upon examination of your file, it appears that according to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations, there are issues with your **2020** tax return information.

In order to resolve this problem and continue with your financial aid processing, you must do one of the following:

<u>Option 1:</u> File an amended federal income tax return <u>revising your exemptions claimed</u> and submit the IRS Tax Return Transcript **and** a signed copy of the IRS Form 1040X, "Amended U.S. Individual Tax Return" to the Office of Financial Aid.

A 2018 Tax Return Transcript for your parents can be obtained online at <u>www.irs.gov</u> or by calling 1-800-908-9946. According to Federal regulations colleges can no longer accept copies of personal tax returns.

OR

<u>Option 2:</u> Obtain a letter of justification from your tax preparer on their professional letterhead stating why your taxes were completed in the current format.
