Articulation Agreement in Visual Arts and New Media

By this agreement, students who complete the Associate of Science (AS) Visual Arts Degree at Dutchess Community College are guaranteed admission, pending GPA review and portfolio review, with full junior standing to the Bachelor of Arts (BA) Visual Arts and New Media Studio Art degree program at Fredonia. By completing at least 60 DCC credits, including the 7/10/30 SUNY-Approved General Education Requirements and other designated courses, such students should be able to complete their BA degree at Fredonia within 4 additional full-time semesters, taking 15-18 credits per semester depending on the concentration selected. Refer to degree pathway page 2. Fredonia offers the following concentrations for the BA Degree:

Animation and Illustration
Drawing and Painting
Ceramics
Graphic Design
Photography
Sculpture
Film and Video Arts

This agreement is for the BA Degree in Visual Arts and New Media only. Fredonia offers BFA degrees in each of the above concentrations. Students interested in pursuing a BFA should consult the Fredonia Visual Arts and New Media department during their first semester at Dutchess.

GPA Criterion: To be guaranteed admission, students must have a minimum cumulative GPA, from all colleges attended, of 2.5.

Portfolio Review Criterion:

Admission to the department is a two-part application process, an academic application to the Office of Admissions (admission to the college is based upon a review of academic work) and submission of an acceptable portfolio to the Department of Visual Arts and New Media. Pending portfolio review, additional DCC studio electives may be counted as specific course equivalents at Fredonia.

Minimum Baccalaureate Degree Requirements

Baccalaureate degree requirements are stated in the Fredonia college catalog. Minimum requirements for a Fredonia degree include:

- 1) 120 unduplicated credit hours
- 2) A cumulative quality grade point average of 2.0 (requirements may vary by major)
- 3) 66 credits from disciplines other than the major discipline
- 4) 45 upper level (300 and above) credit hours
- 5) Residency requirement of 45 credits at Fredonia

2018 Fredonia Foundations

In fall 2018, Fredonia will implement a new general education program called Fredonia Foundations. Students transferring prior to fall 2018 will need to refer to the college catalog for the College Core Curriculum requirements. Fredonia Foundations category courses will be aligned with high-level themes, such as critical thinking and analysis, creative thinking and innovation, and global perspectives and diversity, to enhance development of important knowledge and skills to become creative, responsible, and engaged global citizens.

Transfer students who have completed 7/10/30 (at least 7 of the 10 SUNY General Education Requirements and at least 30 credits of SUNY General Education courses), and who have this verified on their General Education Transcript Addendum (GETA), will have satisfied the Fredonia Foundations Program requirements.

Transfer students who have not completed 7/10/30 at DCC will need to complete the Fredonia Foundations category requirements. Fredonia Foundations category requirements include a minimum of 30 credits, including one course in each of the following categories: Written Communication, Oral Communication, Arts, Humanities, Natural Science, Social Science, one course from two of the following categories: American History, Western Civilization, and Other World Civilizations. There will also be a Foreign Language requirement. Students will complete the program with courses that fulfill needed categories with corresponding themes.
